 Micah Challenge India



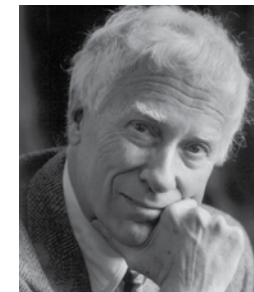
